GOOD NEWS FOR PETROL PRICES

The latest information from the Central Energy Fund shows that petrol prices may be cut, however, diesel is on track for a small price hike.

Based on the latest data, the price of 95 unleaded petrol is expected to fall by around R1.02 a litre. At current levels, the 95 petrol price in Johannesburg could move to below R22.40 a litre - the lowest since May this year. The price of 93 petrol could drop by around 90c a litre.

However, diesel price is currently on track for a hike of between 10c to 15c a litre.

While it's not a significant increase – 10 - 15 cents per litre – The Automobile Association's (AA) Layton Beard said it is still an increase nevertheless and will have a noticeable impact on the agricultural, manufacturing, and road freight sectors. He added that the increase in diesel is decelerating compared to previous increases, which is a positive.

Diesel prices are remaining stickier than petrol because of a squeeze on diesel supplies worldwide.



THE OIL CONUNDRUM -AN EXPERT OPINION

Fred Razak, the chief trading strategist at CMTrading, weighs in on the state of the international oil market, currently under severe pressure and scrutiny due to the Russia-Ukraine crisis, rising prices and 2030's looming climate deadlines in Europe and the USA. The subject of oil is hotly contested in our current climate. Most of us are familiar with the story surrounding the discussion about oil. Russia – an oil-producing country – is at war with Ukraine. Europe and the United States have voiced their support for Ukraine, and President Joe Biden recently announced a \$3 billion military aid package to Russia's beleaguered neighbour.

Additionally, the European Union and the United States aim to implement significant steps to move away from fossil fuels by 2030. So, where does this leave oil?

Even when electric vehicles become more commonplace in developed markets than fossil fuel-powered vehicles, big oil will still – at least for the foreseeable future – be needed elsewhere. Oil is also used to make many other items we use every day. Some of these are surprising. Even wind turbines – touted as one of the solutions for clean energy – use some oil-based plastic products.

Oil and natural gas are also used to create the asphalt we use on our roads. It is an ingredient in cosmetics, creams, deodorants, and medical equipment like MRI machines. It is still widely used in construction, in many lubricants, waxes, paints, and a variety of other things we see daily that may come as a surprise.

Many developing markets are also not equipped to become climate neutral yet. Fossil fuel-powered vehicles are likely to be around far longer in those markets than in Europe and the United States.

Although the fuel decrease is welcome, prices remain high and ploys to decrease fuel consumption keep popping up. However, the question is, are there any consequences to these gimmicks?

Eugene Herbert, CEO of MasterDrive, says do not make the mistake of trying any hack in the hopes it will decrease consumption, with no effect on your vehicle if it does not. "It cannot be stressed enough that the only thing intended to go into your fuel tank is fuel," says Herbert. Previously, it was revealed fuel pills were not only proven ineffective in international studies but showed negative effects on your engine in various ways, primarily by causing carbon build-up.

"Now a gimmick is making the rounds showing the use of Coca-Cola instead of fuel. The company associated with this video has since distanced itself from it, however, if you were wondering if Coca-Cola is a safe substitute for fuel, the answer is no. "You are likely to do damage to your vehicle that will cost much more than the potential savings." Be cautious of the techniques employed to save fuel, especially if they involve putting foreign substances into fuel tanks, warns Herbert. "It is not true that if it doesn't work, 'no harm, no foul'. It can cause a lot of harm, which is not worth the supposed savings of these products," said Herbert. "Research proves it does not provide fuel savings and only harms your vehicle. "You will achieve more effective results with tried-and-tested means of reducing fuel consumption." He said these include defensive driving techniques: keeping a three-second following distance; avoiding speeding; anticipating changing traffic conditions; avoiding reckless driving; planning routes; keeping revs below 3000rpm, and removing any unnecessary weight from the vehicle.
