MORE PETROL PRICE CUTS

ON THE CARDS

Due to a stronger rand and lower global oil prices, South Africa's petrol and diesel prices are likely to see its fifth consecutive price drop since May 2024.

Economists are confident that South Africans can look forward to a sizeable petrol price cut in October and several more for the rest of the year. Petrol and diesel prices are set to decrease by approximately R1.09 per litre. If this becomes a reality, that means petrol will be around R4.60 per litre lower than in October 2023.

This significant over-recovery is thanks to a stronger rand in September and lower global oil prices—both of which have worked in motorists' favour and are set to continue doing so.


Oil prices, in particular, have decreased with a fair amount, with the BER pointing to reports that Saudi Arabia is ready to abandon its unofficial price target of \$100/bbl and wants to ramp up production to regain market share.

Logistics Sector sees Recovery Amidst Slower Growth

Compared to 2023, the transport and freight industries are showing improvement, with the road freight sector reflecting positive growth despite various setbacks.

The latest Ctrack Transport and Freight Index (Ctrack TFI) shows a rise to 125.6, marking a 1.7% increase from April and a 2.5% rise compared to the previous year. This continuous growth over three months hints at a potential positive impact on the transport sector's contribution to GDP in Q2. Among the index's subsectors, air freight saw the highest monthly increase (+5.5%), followed by road freight (+2.7%). Compared to the same period last year, five out of six subsectors showed growth, with only pipeline transport experiencing a decline.

In May, South Africa's road freight sub-sector, dominating 83.6% of all freight payload, continued its recovery with a 2.7% monthly increase, marking the third consecutive month of positive growth after a year-long decline. Quarterly, road freight rose by a notable 8.6%.

Heavy vehicle traffic on the N3 toll route increased by 6.6% in May, contrasting with a double-digit decline on the N4 route due to earlier travel restrictions and port issues redirecting traffic to Port of Maputo. As port operations rebounded in May, additional traffic demand on the N4 route diminished.

In May, South Africa's rail freight sub-sector faced a slight setback but continued its gradual overall recovery. From January to May 2024, rail freight increased by 11.0% compared to the same period in 2023, despite starting from a low base. Operation Vulindlela has been pivotal in this progress, aiming to boost Transnet's capacity and reverse the shift of goods from rail to road.
